CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE



CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE ARE AMONG THE MOST COMMON CRANIOFACIAL ANOMALIES. A CLEFT IS A GAP IN THE MOUTH THAT DIDN'T CLOSE DURING THE EARLY STAGES OF PREGNANCY.

HOW OFTEN DOES CLEFT OCCUR?

It is estimated that, worldwide, a child is born every three minutes with a cleft, about one in every 500 to 750 births.

CAUSES OF CLEFT

Many risk factors can increase the likelihood of cleft lip and cleft palate. Though all causes have yet to be identified, we know that genetics, pre-existing medical conditions, poor nutrition and exposure to harmful environmental substances can affect the healthy development of a baby.

LIVING WITH CLEFT

Depending on the type and severity, a cleft can create serious emotional and health issues if it is not corrected, such as:

- Difficulty with feeding, which in some parts of the world can lead to malnutrition or even starvation.
- Recurring ear infections can occur and lead to hearing loss.
- Dental development can be affected.
- Speech and language development can also be impaired.
- Children may also suffer from bullying and social isolation.



CLEFT LIP AND CLEFT PALATE



SINCE 1982, OPERATION SMILE HAS BEEN DEDICATED TO FINDING FAMILIES AFFECTED BY CLEFT AND PROVIDING THEM WITH SAFE SURGERY SO THAT THEY CAN LIVE HAPPY AND HEALTHY LIVES.

HEALING A CHILD'S CLEFT

Surgery is an effective solution for children and adults suffering from cleft lip and cleft palate. It has been proven to improve a patient's overall health and well-being, and it helps to restore dignity and hope. In an ideal situation, a pediatrician and a plastic surgeon work with a child's parents soon after the child's birth to choose the best timing for surgery. Most doctors agree that a cleft lip should be repaired by the time a baby is 3 months old and that a cleft palate should be repaired between the ages of 12 and 18 months. For many families in low- and middle-income countries, early surgery may not be an option due to lack of financial resources, qualified medical staff and other factors.



2018 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Yet in too many places around the world, surgery is inaccessible or unavailable. That's what drives our volunteers and staff to bring the highest quality of care to our patients at our care locations and medical missions. We create lasting impacts not only on the people we serve, but on entire health systems through our model of comprehensive cleft care and training and education programs.

2018 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

156 MEDICAL PROGRAMS

We conducted 156 medical programs across 90 sites in 29 countries. Of that total, 102 missions were conducted by a majority of local medical volunteers.

17 NEW SITES IN 12 COUNTRIES

Medical programs extended to 17 new sites in 12 countries, including Colombia, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Italy, Madagascar, Mexico, Morocco, Philippines, United Arab Emirates, Venezuela and Vietnam.

17,262 PATIENTS

In the 2018 fiscal year, we provided 17,262 patients with surgery and dental care at medical programs and care centers in 29 countries.

401,470 PATIENT INTERACTIONS

An Operation Smile patient receives far more than just one surgery. The multidisciplinary teams that care for each of our patients can include as many as 23 volunteer medical professionals, each of whom can interact with patients multiple times during medical programs or throughout the year at care centers.

85 PERCENT OF MEDICAL VOLUNTEERS

We're proud that 85 percent of the medical volunteer positions filled on our missions last year were held by health care professionals from low- and middle-income countries; a majority of whom received training and education from Operation Smile.

397,312 HOURS OF TIME

Last year, 6,906 medical volunteer positions were filled by skilled and passionate professionals, donating 397,312 hours valued at \$31,181,848.

34 CARE CENTERS IN 19 COUNTRIES

Operation Smile operates 34 care centers in 19 countries, including four new locations in Italy, Venezuela and Thailand, providing year-round medical services.



FUNDRAISING IDEAS

MEDICAL RECORD SUPPLIES

Operation Smile medical professionals provide health care assessments to determine which children can safely undergo surgery. We bring everything we need to help with our screenings – from pens to staplers and many other items that may be unavailable at the medical mission site. These donated items will help us serve more children around the world.

CHILD LIFE THERAPY SUPPLIES

The Operation Smile child life therapy room is the last stop for a patient before the operating room. Licensed therapists facilitate therapeutic play and activities by explaining and demonstrating every aspect of care to our patients.

SMILE BAGS

After receiving surgery, each child receives a Smile Bag filled with small personal care items, toys and a mirror to see their new smile. Clubwomen can sew the cloth bags or collect the items that go into each bag.

SMILE SPLINTS

Proper healing is essential for a healthy new smile. Smile Splints prevent a child from bending their arms and touching their stitches. A sewing pattern and instruction sheet is available upon request.

CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL GOWNS

A clean, fun hospital gown will bring joy to a child's face before and after surgery. Yet hospitals in low-and middle-income countries may have few or no resources to provide them. A gown pattern is available from Operation Smile. Contact us for more information.

QUILTS, BLANKETS & AFGHANS

Few things give more comfort to a child in a hospital than a warm, soft blanket. Clubwomen can help provide blankets for children receiving an Operation Smile surgery. For some children, this will be the first blanket they've ever owned. Please contact us for sizing and instruction sheets.
